



Lanier Phillips Award for International Students GCSU International Student Association Caucus

The Lanier Phillips Award for international students has been established by the GCSU International Students Association Caucus. Lanier Phillips was an advocate who fought against racial discrimination throughout his life. An American navy officer, he was shipwrecked off the coast of St. Lawrence in 1942 during a time of racial segregation. Rescued and cared for by the people of St. Lawrence, Mr. Phillips realized that he was treated with equality, and this was his springboard to continue his fight against discrimination in the United States. In honour of his life's work, the Lanier Phillips Award, valued at \$300.00, will be given to an international student who demonstrates leadership skills, and as well advocates on behalf of others. The recipient would have demonstrated an involvement in student life, both within the international student community and the overall student body. Applicants should also have demonstrated both on campus and off campus involvement. Applicants should be a full-time, undergraduate or graduate international student at Grenfell Campus. Award recipients should currently maintain a cumulative average of not less than sixty-five percent (65%).

The GCSU President and the International Student Programming Coordinator, on the recommendation of the Awards Committee, presents this award.
